This entertainment is a part of the regular commencement exercises to which the public look forward each year. The baccalaureate sermon will be delivered by Rev. Gilmore at the Methodist church Sunday morning, May 22. All the churches will unite for this service. The graduating exercises will be held in the Odd Fellows hall on Tuesday evening, May 24.

TALKS ON SALE OF PLANT AND CITY'S FUTURE NEEDS

In speaking of the sale of the water and light plant H. F. Davidson in an interview with the News says:

"The rapid development of this section made the extension and improvement of a power and water plant a serious matter to owners of small means so we were compelled to sell or make new financial arrangements or assume a large indebtedness. This I did not care to do. We took the business when it was a physical and financial wreck and by strict economy in management brought the business to a point where it interested large concerns. We hope and believe the sale and transfer of the property will be the means of extensive improvements in the line of public utilities. This community needs some large manufacturing establishments, an electric railway line and largely increased power facilities. This requires a strong financial company to construct and operate it. We hope also in making this sale to forever eliminate the personal feeling that has grown out of local ownership and operation of the business. With the bright prospects ahead of this city it is high time to forget such matters and do business along business lines. Now that I have sold my interest in the water system I hope I can be credited with making a business suggestion without being accused of being biased on account of personal interest and I feel constrained to say from a purely business standpoint that spending any large sum of money to bring the Tucker spring to the city is a serious financial mistake. It is only a makeshift that in a few years will be outgrown by the town. It is not in the right location to be used with any other supply except as an independent source, which means an unnecessary initial expense.

"With the rapid development of the community the districts outside of the city will soon need a new supply of drinking water as badly as the city and the city and county should co-operate to some extent in arranging for a permanent and adequate supply for all time which can be done now at comparatively little cost but which may be both difficult and costly a few years hence. There is ample water in the present system for another year or two which can be operated profitably by the city at any price not exceeding \$75,000 and can be bought for considerably less. In the meantime, a permanent plan can be adopted which will forever settle the water question for both the city and valley. I believe that the public is now satisfied that the typhoid scare used for political purposes was a bugaboo in which there was no foundation and that with personal differences eliminated the old unanimity of action should prevail that made Hood River famous. The water question should be settled on a business instead of a sentimental basis. We will soon need an additional water supply and should have a good one at as low a cost as possible. Ninety per cent of the public have treated us fairly and while I believe undue influences were brought to bear to induce a large majority to vote against their own as well as our interests this matter will right itself in time. If it is righted now the expense will be but a few thousand dollars, but if postponed it will aggregate a large sum. Owing to lack of sufficient funds at times we have been unable to have the service up to our desire. I wish to take this opportunity however to thank the many friends who have given us their support."

EGGS, HENS KITTENS, ETC.
