A CHICAGO VIEW OF FRUIT DAMAGE

While it is true that considerable damage to fruit and vegetable crops was done by the April freezes, yet the reports of such damage as they appear in the daily newspapers are so ridiculous as to be humorous, says the Chicago Packer.

In this connection the Detroit Saturday Night has published a few "crop damage reports" from a "corps of special correspondents" and a perusal of these may not prove altogether a loss of time, so the Packer reproduces them herewith.

"Chicago—The damage to fruit by the recent storms will total \$2,100,000,000. Not a blade of green is left in the valley of the Mississippi.

"Cheyenne, Wyoming—The recent storms and frosts have damaged the crops throughout the west \$5,000,000,000. All apple, peach, coconut, pea, banana, prune and grape buds in this state are killed.

"Tombstone, Ariz.—The frosts and cold winds have done \$5,000,000,000,000,000 damage to fruit and other crops in the middle west. Michigan is wiped off the map—all but a little sand and the prison at Jackson.

"Grand Rapids—Fruit growers here declare it untrue that frosts have injured the fruit crop. They say the cold has merely killed the bugs and worms, and that apples, peaches, plums, grapes, etc., etc., etc., will be finer and more plentiful than ever before.

"South Haven—SI Horkins, a veteran fruit raiser, says his orchards have been injured by the frosts. He thinks the cold weather will do good as it will tend to increase mortality among fruit thieves, and thus next fall's crop will be safer than ever before. He estimates the saving from this one item in this county alone at \$777,777,777.

"Squash Creek—The Amalgamated Association of Fruit Growers met last night and adopted a vote of thanks to the weather man. The experts here all say the recent frosts will increase the quality of fruit in a marvelous way, as the cold toughens the buds and insures enormous apples, peaches, pears and plums. It is expected that it will take only a couple of dozen peaches to make a bushel this year, and the association already figures on raising the price to \$5. This should mean an added profit of \$99,999,999 for farmers of this county alone."
