MARBLE CHAPTER HOUSE FOR SPOKANE

Spokane Chapter of the American Woman's League will have the most unique quarters in the world, if the plans now under the way meet with the approval of the executive officers of the national association. A. H. Jarman, president of the Washington Phones. 26 or 2002-X Marble company, has sent a letter to Mrs. John F. Davies, treasurer of the local organization, offering to furnish, free of charge, to the chapter sufficient Grecian Skyros marble, which has a commercial value of \$30 a cubic foot, in saw blocks at the quarries for exterior and interior construction.

Mr. Jarman, who came recently from San Jose, Cal., and W. H. Botleau, recording teller at the Traders National bank of Spokane, discovered the rare marble ledges 10 days ago while on an exploration tour in Stevens county, 15 miles northeast of Colville, Wash., 20 varieties, ranging from deep purple to pure white, being brought to the surface. The Identity of the specimens was established by marble experts in Spokane, where several specimens were cut and polished.

Three big veins have been explored at depth, 20 distinct varieties being uncovered. The color range is remarkable, including purple, brownish gray, pale gold and pure white. The stone is finely grained, is impervious to stain and moisture and is not affected by ink, oil or climatic conditions. Experts say this is the first discovery of highly colored marbles in North America, also that the quality of the stone is equal, if not superior, to any in the world.

Charles M. Fassett, president of the Spokane chamber of commerce, probably the foremost chemist and metallurgist in the Pacific northwest, declared, after testing the marble, that the discovery is one of the most important recorded on this continent in recent years, adding that the opening of the deposits means the development of a new resource of almost inestimable wealth,
