**STREET OILING
NOT EXPENSIVE**

Property owners on State street who have been investigating street oiling have secured information to the effect that in Portland where it has been tried it has cost property owners less than \$180 per mile for a twenty foot street. On the country roads in Multnomah where it has been applied in large quantities the cost has been about \$200 per mile. The matter has been taken up with the idea of oiling a block or two in the city and giving it a test. It is thought that relief from the dust and its benefit in preserving the street will discount the cost many times.
