Employees Indemnity Law
An act to be voted on by the people of the state that will be placed on the ballot at the November election provides for a commission to report to the legislature upon the matter of indemnity to employes for injuries sustained in course of their employment. The commission will frame laws which it will submit to the legislature covering the indemnity for injuries sustained in the course of their employment.
The following named citizens of the state of Oregon have been selected as members of the commission: Archbishop Christie, W. H. Corbett, Bishop Scadding, Robert A. Booth, Rev. Ben. Young, Judge Thomas F. Ryan, Prof. F. G. Young, Robert D. Inman and John S. Bradley.
In the event of the death, failure or refusal of any of the commissioners to act either before or after the taking effect of the act vacancies are to be filled by appointments made by the governor, chief justice of the supreme court and the state treasurer.
