TIMELY HINTS ON BOILING WATER

Water this summer should be boiled. Last summer it was served both boiled and roasted. This summer, however, it seems that it will be more popular to boil it.
To boil water properly you should get up early in the morning and make a hot fire. Be sure to have the fire hot, otherwise the water won't boil. While the fire is heating if you haven't a galvanized iron tub take your largest saucepan, pot or kettle, (in an emergency the coal scuttle will do) and grasp it firmly by the collar. Then take a pound of chloride of lime, one scrubbing brush and go to it. When scrubbed to a frazzle rinse well with water. By no means use water from the tap to rinse with. If you can't borrow some of the boiled article from your neighbor it will be handy for you to secure a bucket and take a little jaunt out to the Tucker spring. Having filled your bucket return home. Avoid coming around by the reservoir on the heights as the water may become contaminated. If the fire is out when you get home make another. After rinsing the vessel you are going to boil the water in scrub again with formaldehyde and if you are not sure that it is bug proof use one quart of carbolic acid. Then place the vessel carefully under the tap and let the water trickle into it slowly. By doing this many of the colon bacilli will hop over the edge of the vessel and make for the sewer. If you can secure a microscope it will be interesting for you to watch the little fellows running for dear life to escape being boiled. You see, they are tired of being boiled, they'd rather be fried. After filling vessel place on stove, screw the lid on tight and let boil until sundown. Then set in safe and throw on the combination. It will then be time to go to bed.
Of course, if you can use the tub you can boil more water, but be careful to set it where the baby can't fall into it, for although boiled water is harmless it is very wet. For those who desire an added flavor an old boot leg cut in pieces an inch square and dropped into the glass when served will be relished. Those who care to take a little more trouble can have their water baked, fricasseed, stewed or scalloped, although it is not recommended in this form.
One drink of boiled water is guaranteed to produce a most beautiful fit of the blues in five minutes and its continued use for a week will transform the most cheerful into a hypochondriac.

WHITE SALMON SHOWS GROWTH AND PROSPERITY

A visit to our neighboring city across the river shows enterprise and progress and indicates that the hustling residents of White Salmon have faith in their country. While seekers for fruitland are not as numerous there this season as they were last year, city property has taken a boom and lots in four subdivisions have been disposed of in a short time at increasing values. A movement is on foot to pave the three main business streets, and a \$10,000 brick high school will soon be erected to provide for the increasing school population.
More city lots are said to have been sold at White Salmon in the past six months than have been disposed of before in three years. Both banks show increased deposits and other business houses report increased trade.
A new laundry operated by electricity and owning its building has been installed, a brick block erected during the year, and the town now has a modern playhouse. Tents of new residents dot the town in all directions and several expensive houses are being built, one of them on the bluff overlooking the river, at an expense of \$5,000 to \$10,000.
An electric railroad extending into the valley is one of the things being looked forward to and a new wagon road into the Pine Flat country is also under consideration. A daily automobile service has been established between White Salmon and Trout Lake this summer and hundreds of strangers are going to that popular resort and exploring the country.

Rain and Hail in Streaks

About 10:30 Sunday forenoon Jupiter Pluvius opened the headgates of his irrigation system and poured out upon this vicinity tons of hail stones and water aggregating .20 of an inch in about 30 minutes. The shower ran by streaks across the county from Wasco into Gilliam, with here a streak of mud and there a streak of dust, showing the work and track of the storm from Kent to the North End. At Ed McMillin's farm the downpour was equal to a cloud burst, and destroyed his large barn.—More Observer.
