Hood River will be given a big boost by the American Progress Magazine, in the September issue. C. J. Wilson, a well-known cartoonist, formerly connected with the New York World, and A. Curtis Thompson, a newspaper man who is known all along the Pacific coast, will carry out the unique system of advertising this vicinity, telling of its products, resources and business men, and incidentally to increase the subscription list of the publication which they represent.

The movement is a novel idea of awakening interest in a community with a stranger by giving him something of a personal perspective, which will greatly assist the work of dry statistics and good illustrations in introducing a locality to the outside world.

Mr. Wilson will cartoon the principal business and professional men, those who are engaged in conscientious and earnest boosting, while data will be given regarding the scenery, resources, products of the localities, etc., for the magazine, which is devoted to impartially boosting every section of the west. The American Progress was formerly published at San Francisco, but Portland is now its home.

The September issue of the publication will have a large section devoted to Hood River and vicinity. No charges will be made for the writing or the pictures. The magazine relies entirely upon the sale of extra copies and the advertising it will receive, for its compensation.

The series of articles, of which the local writeup will be a part, are published with the idea of acquainting Americans with America, and the articles are placed under the head of "Seeing America."

Messrs. Wilson and Thompson are reliable men, besides being workers of much ability, and they deserve the cooperation of local people in securing data, cartoons and pictures for the article on Hood River and vicinity, which many will look forward to seeing in the September issue of the American Progress Magazine.

McMINNVILLE TO HAVE \$4,000 CHAPTER HOUSE

McMinnville is to have the \$4,000 Chapter House, of which the News Reporter made mention recently. Members of the Shakespeare Club, Self Improvement Club and Civic Improvement Club are enthusiastic in the matter, and what these women undertake is as good as accomplished. The national organization of the American Woman's League has made a bona fide offer to the women of McMinnville to build and furnish the club house for a local organization, and to maintain it free of all expense to the local Chapter if their reasonable conditions are fulfilled. These conditions are as follows: McMinnville is to secure a local membership of 75 fully paid members to the National League.

Many of the leading magazines are supporting the movement with time and influence, and Success Magazine has recently given the league, as an endowment, one-fourth of its capital stock, valued at \$250,000. There are many advantages to individual members which are not dependent upon the organization of a large local Chapter, and which are well worth all the effort it will take to complete membership, but it is the Chapter House which the women of McMinnville are working for. It is said that Los Angeles is working for a Chapter House that will cost \$25,000.—News Reporter.

OLD TIMER FINDS RARE PIPE ORCHID

Flint Bradford, who came down from Mt. Hood Wednesday, exhibited a rare curiosity at the News office, consisting of a species of orchid which in form resembles an Indian pipe. The color of this dainty specimen of botany is pure white. It is waxlike in appearance and is considered by botanists quite a find. Recently the Oregonian published a lengthy article about it, which attracted much attention. Flint, however, says that "pipe" orchids are common at Hood River, and states that the specimens he brought to town were secured on the place of D. R. Cooper, in the upper valley, and are found in moist, shady spots. He left one of the specimens at the News office, where it attracted much attention and interest.
