PUBLIC VOICE

EDITOR NEWS:
Dear Sir—It would be interesting to know how much money is spent this year in the state by the rum interests to make it appear that more liquor is sold in prohibition counties than in high-license counties.

There are no greater law breakers than the saloon men, and it is very reasonable to presume they are not in full sympathy with the truth. If prohibitory law did not at least reduce the consumption of intoxicating liquors, is it supposed these men would spend so much time and money to fight it as they do? I have no doubt in some rough communities, where counties voted dry, the wet element did all that was possible to bring the law into disrepute, with the hope of forcing a repeal. But are we as a people to be controlled by this lawless element? The law is right, and a penalty should be attached for non-enforcement.

Which is the most commendable: To yield to the baser qualities of individuals or strive to right such wrongs as will tend to develop good in their characters?

The open saloon more than any other avenue is continually gathering in its victims. Your correspondent takes this position: No person has a moral right to vote in favor of a great wrong, which must include the licensed liquor saloon, as well as laws against murder, arson and theft; and when this fact is universally recognized, there will not be such statements, that "prohibition does not prohibit."

The writer does not expect to see Oregon dry in 1910, but she does expect the time will come when our nation will be dry, when the children of the future will ask why such an institution as the American saloon, which has done so much damage in the world, was ever allowed to live by law.
