

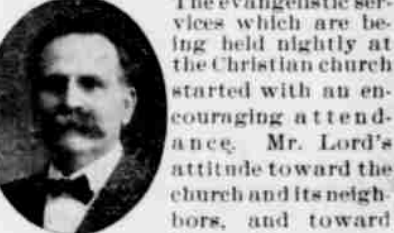
**AT THE CHURCHES**
