INNOVATION IN BUYING APPLES

An innovation in apple buying took place last week at Hood River when the first big buy of an orchard crop was made on the tree, the purchaser contracting to pick, pack and market the crop. The crop sold is that in the orchard of the Crescent Fruit company under the management of W. G. Parmelee, and was bought by August Paasch.

It is estimated that there are between 5,000 and 6,000 boxes of apples in the orchard, most of which are Spitzenburgs and Newtowns. In estimating the yield Mr. Paasch and Mr. Parmelee state that after going over the ground they were only 45 boxes apart in their guesses.

The crop is on six-year-old trees

and it is stated by Mr. Parmelee that the amount received for it will pay a good rate of interest on an investment of \$100,000. From the time the contract was signed the seller was relieved of all responsibility for the crop, the buyer taking over the entire care of the orchard, including the picking, packing and marketing.

It is thought by some of the orchardists that the deal is the forerunner of others that will come as the big acreage in the valley commences to become developed, particularly where growers are not in a position to care for packers and who do not possess the facilities for getting their fruit to market.

The crop will be packed and shipped with that of the Paasch orchard which this year goes to Rae & Hatfield of New York.

PUSHING WHITE SALMON ELECTRIC ROAD SURVEY

The permanent survey for the Mt. Adams electric line has been completed as far as Robertsville and the cost for construction of the whole line calculated at \$20,000 per mile. The route of the line takes it clear to Trout Lake and back via Husum, but the course from Robertsville is not yet certain, depending on whether the greater part of the Camas Prairie district wants the line to tap their territory. The farmers of the lower part of that rich territory have already subscribed for stock. If the people of the upper part, and particularly the Glenwood vicinity, want the line subscription for stock will be required as an indication of their good will. If no inducement is made for the line to veer that way it will swing to the left circling Fulda and Laurel to Trout Lake.

The Mt. Adams line will leave the White Salmon dock, climb a three per cent grade to White Salmon, but instead of going to Cook's addition will strike north from the Hunsaker place to section 16, then east across Wilkin's canyon to Apple Center, then to Mt. Brook and from there on to Robertsville. At no place in its entire course will there be more than a four per cent grade.

Secretary Supleier reports \$70,000 in sight in stock, subscription, notes, mortgages and rights-of-way. As soon as it is shown that the route is feasible—which has now been determined by the recent survey—there is \$2,000,000 of outside capital at their disposal. The secretary's office is now located in the Smith building and on its walls are blue prints of the new electric line, showing every part of the road. It certainly looks like business. It shows up fine on paper and the Enterprise believes that it will work out as fine as it looks.

The company as constituted at present is composed of local capitalists who have incorporated for \$50,000. By-laws have been adopted and a campaign will shortly start for the two million dollars with which to build the road.—White Salmon Enterprise.
