## BOWERMAN FOR STATE ECONOMY

Commenting on the features of his platform Jay Bowerman, acting governor and assembly candidate for the Republican nomination for governor, said he had observed from traveling through the western Oregon counties that, in this campaign, the voters are disposed seriously to consider the specific promises of candidates rather than unquestioningly to accept glittering generalities and broad statements. Concerning his own platform, Mr. Bowerman said voters are especially interested in that plank which proposes the inauguration of a business system in the conduct of the state's business affairs by which many thousands of dollars would be saved to the taxpayers in the purchase of supplies for the different state institutions.

"Under the present system of purchasing supplies for the state," said Mr. Bowerman, "each of the seven state institutions purchases its supplies separately. This plan should be changed. If nominated and elected I shall advocate and, if possible, inaugurate a needed reform in this connection.

"All supplies for the state institutions should be brought together and a saving of probably \$50,000 annually effected to the taxpayers. Under the system which has always been in vogue, by which each institution purchases its supplies independently of the others there is a wide discrepancy in the price paid by the different institutions for the same articles."

## SPREADING OREGON'S NAME AND FAME

The Oregonian says that mention like this from the Springfield, Mass., Republican, pure reading matter, first column, editorial page, helps to bring Oregon to the fore:

"A good many New Englanders feel that they have transacted quite a piece of business when they sell the 15 to 20 barrels of apples grown in their orchards each year. There are larger transactions in New York state, but for real apple-buying one must look to the Oregon and Washington orchards. A big transaction of the sort was completed last week, when the crop handled by the Hood River growers' association was sold in one lot to a New York house. It is supposed to be the biggest red apple deal on record and between 400 and 500 carloads of apples were sold for about \$400,000."

By the time the paragraph is copied into numerous exchanges, which is sure to happen, a whole lot of eastern folk will be puckering their lips for some of the incomparably fine fruit therein mentioned. Meantime, the Hood River association will not take unkindly the hint that a box of extra fancy Spitzenburgs be sent, charges prepaid, to the editor of our distinguished New England contemporary, not exactly as an honorarium, but to demonstrate the worthiness of the product so generously noticed.

The matter being called to the attention of C. H. Sprout, manager of the Apple Growers' Union, a box of Spitzenburgs will be sent to the Republican with a letter expressing the appreciation of the union.
