Boys or Breweries

Editor News: Dear Sir-Judging from reports, the National Liquor Dealers' Association believes "probibitton will prohibit," by their sending many into our state to defeat prohibition. Evidently they will not yield without a struggle. If they get 2,000,000 boys every year, as they freely declare they must have in order to continue their traffic, they must use every means within their power and keep open night and day, that their purpose and plans may be fulfilled. The liquor interests have deceived voters so many times, they think they are secure now, for votes and influence can be purchased yet and they have the money, wrenched from thousands of poor families all over our land.

When will men understand there is no business of an honorable nature or any class of citizens in our state but what will be immensely benefitted by a dry Oregon in 1910.

November 1st will see the completion of some valuable tests now being made at the Oregon Agricultural College by Prof. James Dryden, poultry husbandman, which will prove means of the trapnest which Prof. which is now in use at a number of experiment stations and poultry farms of the country, he has several hundred hens out of the college flock of 2,000 chickens making laying records.
