SAYS OREGON LIVELIEST CENTER IN THE COUNTRY

Oregon today is the liveliest center of the nation, according to Louis Gerlinger, president of the Columbia Valley Railroad Company, who has just returned from a month's stay in New York. "All eastern business interests are waiting for the election and its results," said Mr. Gerlinger yesterday. "The railroads are holding off construction work. But I return to Oregon to find business bigger and better than ever. "The reason for it is that Wall street no longer controls the Pacific coast. Our centers of money influence are here. We are not dependent upon Wall street nor upon any eastern power for our prosperity. Our prosperity lies in our own resources, and we do not need to wait for an election to see whether we are going to win or lose. All the east seemed to be quiet. All Oregon hums with development."
