BOWERMAN CAPTURES HOOD RIVER COUNTY

(Continued from Page 1)

Without hesitation or unnecessary verbiage Mr. Bowerman addressed his hearers, jumping right into the fray and outlining his views of the duties of the state's executive with a force and in such a clear and concise manner as to get the attention and commendation of every man in the room. In regard to the expenditure of public moneys and the duties of the state's employees he was uncompromising, saying that it was the duty of the governor to save the state every dollar that was commensurate with good government, and that he proposed to do so if elected. The employees of the state, he said, would not be allowed, if he was elected, to spend the people's time in building up their political fences or those of anyone else.

On the normal school question he said that he voted to dispense with the schools at the last session of the legislature because they were ineffective and too much of a burden to the state. He believed, he said, in normal school training, but he wanted it conducted in the most efficient and economical manner. For this reason he was in favor of allowing the matter to go before the people through the initiative and referendum for settlement, instead of being subjected to the continual log rolling that was being done at every session of the legislature to get appropriations to maintain them.

In regard to the direct primary law he said:

If I am elected governor I will veto any and every measure which attempts or undertakes to amend, change or repeal the direct primary law, Statement No. 1, or any other law adopted by the people, or any part of any of them. As a member of the senate and president of that body, I have never endeavored in any way, manner or form to induce any other member to violate his obligation or pledge under Statement No. 1, and if I am elected governor I shall pursue the same course and shall not in any manner or by any means interfere or attempt to interfere with the conduct of any member in this particular, or induce him to violate his pledge.

It is impossible for the governor to prevent the passage of any law for the legislature has it within its power to pass a bill over the veto of the governor. In order to prevent the possibility of any attempt being made to amend, modify or repeal any of these statutes, I would suggest that the candidates for the legislature be invited to subscribe to the same obligation I have heretofore taken and now take, namely, that they will oppose in every way any attempt to amend, modify or repeal any law made by the people. This will be an effectual guaranty to the people that these men, when elected, will not undertake to tamper with these laws, and I respectfully call upon the nominees to define their position upon this question.

Replying to the continued assertions of the Democratic press that Mr. Bowerman is a corporation attorney and represents the railroad interests in seeking the office of governor, he completely refuted this oft repeated statement, which is acknowledged by the opposition leaders to be the only club they can use with the hope of affecting Mr. Bowerman's candidacy. The latter manfully and frankly stated that he is an attorney, that he is in business to give his professional services to any legitimate parties or purpose for which he receives the proper remuneration. But, that he is or ever has been controlled by the railroads or other corporations during his career in public office he indignantly denied and he cited many instances where he had voted and worked against legislation that the corporations were either trying to have passed or opposed to. In this connection he invited criticism and asked the public to put its finger upon any blot in his career either in private or public life.

In closing Governor Bowerman made reference to the real opposition to his election by a small faction in the Republican party. Without casting any personal slurs against Oswald West, the Democratic candidate, Mr. Bowerman said that Mr. West was the candidate of Jonathan Bourne, who desired to build up a state machine and to insure if possible his election as United States senator. Mr. Bourne knew that he couldn't use Mr. Bowerman for this purpose, therefore, although posing as a Republican, Bourne was doing everything in his power to elect West. When Mr. Bowerman finished speaking he received a rousing ovation.

Mr. Logan, who was then introduced, said:

"I am paying my respects to our senior senator, Jonathan Bourne, at this time, because he is undoubtedly the Democratic candidate for governor

nor in this campaign.

"Oswald West is running for office only as the delegate of Bourne. Let us review Bourne's history briefly to determine whether it is expedient to place ourselves wholly at the mercy of this man.

"Jonathan Bourne's history in Oregon, after he got through with the poker games of Boston and came west for new pastures, is one of corruption. He broke into Oregon politics with a gum-shoe campaign for the legislature in 1896 when he was elected. In January and February of 1897 he established a brothel at Salem for the purpose of holding up the legislature. By his nefarious methods he prevented the enactment of any legislation and made necessary a special session of the legislature.

"The incident cost the taxpayers \$200,000, and a large sum in interest on state money.

"Since then his record has been one of perpetual mischief making and bribery. His party repelled him and he rode into the United States senate in an unguarded moment on the initiative and referendum. In the senate he has been present to represent Oregon only on such occasions when the thermometer was too low to make golf possible. He has been the laughing stock of the senate, the joke and butt of the capitol. When it came to voting on the tariff he admitted publicly knowing so little about it that he had sought the advice of his great and good friend, Aldrich.

"It is quite in the order of things that he should seek at this time to perfect a machine that will help him hold his seat in the senate and for this reason he wants West elected."

A. A. Jayne, who followed Mr. Logan, highly endorsed Mr. Bowerman whom he said he had known since he commenced the practice of law for the office of governor, and said he believed it was a matter of paramount interest to the residents of the state to see that he was elected.

The party left here for The Dalles where Mr. Bowerman held a rousing big meeting Thursday night.
