Insurance Money to Stay Home

Fire insurance premiums in the state of Washington, a considerable part of which have been contributed to San Francisco for many years, will hereafter be paid to home companies or to general agencies within the state. The Pacific Board of Fire Underwriters, a San Francisco institution, has long controlled the Northwestern field for the foreign companies. This board has now abandoned its claim to jurisdiction in the state of Washington. The first benefits of this action should be felt by the companies organized, capitalized and controlled by residents of the state, like the Northwestern Mutual Fire Association. It is simply another phase of promoting the "Made in Washington" idea.
