

New Zealand Is Making Efforts to Ob-

tain Specimens of the Huia. The New Zealand government is making final efforts to obtain living specimens of the huia, one of the many unique features of those unique islands. The birds are becoming extinct because of the fact that they can live only in pairs and because of the desire of the Maoris to use hula feathers as ornaments.

The hula sets a good example to humankind, for the birds, forced to pair off by nature, live in peace and har mony and divide their work exactly as nature intended they should. The male has a short, strong bill, while the beak. The man bird of the family uses his bill to tear the bark from dead trees, while the good wife bird extracts the grubs.
