As early as last week bluebells and buttercups were picked on the flat below the bluff. Can Hood River beat that?

The Masons of this place have been negotiating with Gillette Bros. for the erection of a building. The plan is for the Gillette to extend their present building over the remainder of the lot and run it up two stories, the Masons to take the entire upper floor for a hall.

B. E. Duncan, of a real estate firm of Hood River, has purchased the Markgraf ranch of 320 acres at Camas

Prairie. This is one of the best improved places in the Camas district and is located about four miles this side of Glenwood. The Duncan Company informed the Enterprise that it intends to do considerable operating in the Camas and Trout Lake districts.

Mr. Ordway, employed as orchardist by the White Salmon Orchard Co., of which L. R. Glavis is manager, is one of the most competent orchard men in the whole country. He had charge of the Hood River carload of apples which won first prize at Spokane and Chicago, and was in charge of the packing and handling of the
