NEW OPERA HOUSE FOR HOOD RIVER

Plans were fully perfected Monday for the erection of a new brick block 100x100 feet on the lot formerly occupled by the Fashlon Stables, and owned by C. A. Bell. The building, which has airendy been leased, will be occupied by Portland men and will be two stories, with basement. Work will be commenced immediately and the structure is to be finished, if possible, in 90 days. It is announced that Hood River contractors will have an opportunity to old on the work.

The plans for the big structure provide for a modern opera house and convention hall located in the rear of the building on the First street side. The opera house, it is stated, will be large enough to accommodate the largest gathering expected at Hood River, and will be finished handsomely, with all the conveniences of the modern play

A large apartment for a billiard room and bowling alley will also be constructed on the First street side.

The main floor on Oak street will be put into stores. Of these there will be four, fitted with large plate giass windows and other business conveniences. The second story of the building will be fitted up with apartments of two or more rooms en suite, with disappearing beds, hot and cold water, private baths, etc. There will be no dark rooms, as a court will be constructed in the center of the building.
