SAYS NOT TO WASTE APPLES THIS YEAR

The Chicago Packer advises growers not to waste their cull fruit this year.
"This is no year," says the Packer, "to waste apples. Growers will find that it pays to utilize even the fruit that may not be suitable for packing in barrels, boxes or even shipping to market in bulk. It is a commonly accepted fact that there is going to be a shortage in dried fruits this year. It should not be inferred from this that the apple crop is short, but rather that this season presents unusual conditions, when producers may well resort to the 'by-product policy' of some of the manufacturing institutions, by saving everything. In this connection a prominent dried fruit man of St. Louis has been reported recently as saying:
"The present condition of the dried fruit market merits special attention. The oldest merchants in this line do not remember such a complete clean up of the old stock in twenty years. High prices are almost sure to rule this season.
"It will pay farmers and growers to look carefully after every apple and peach they raise. Even wind falls and gnarly ones should be dried either as chopped apples, cut in slices with peeling on or peeled and cut in rings.
"Apples and peaches are certainly too valuable to feed hogs or to be allowed to rot on the ground. Even apple peelings and cores will bring good prices, as they are used by manufacturers."
