Notice of Sale for Delinquent Assessment
Notice is hereby given that on the 12th day of August, 1911, warrants were duly and regularly issued by the Recorder of the City of Hood River, Oregon, to me directed and delivered, commanding me to forthwith advertise the property mentioned and described therein against which the assessment for the cost of the construction of Division District of the Sewer System of said city was made, and to sell said property or so much thereof as can be sold separately to advance sufficient to pay said delinquent assessment, together with interest, costs and disbursements in the manner provided by law, and to return the proceeds of such sale to the City Treasurer of the City of Hood River, Oregon, and the following is a description of the property against which such assessment was levied and which is delinquent, and gives the name of the person to whom it was assessed, and the amount of the assessment thereon to-wit:

DELINQUENT TAX LIST 1910
This advertised list of delinquent taxes for the year 1910 is in pursuance of an act of the State Legislature, which is embodied in Chapter 275 of the General Laws of the 1911 Session. The taxes on the following ad valorem real property in Hood River County became delinquent on April 4, 1911, and are subject to a penalty of 10 per cent and interest at the rate of 12 per cent per annum until they shall have been paid. Any day after the expiration of six months after the taxes charged against the following real property are delinquent the sheriff is authorized, upon demand of any person making application, to issue to them a certificate of delinquency upon payment of the taxes, penalty interest and cost of advertising.

History And The Apple

If the ancients, as asserted by the Chicago professors, were fortunate enough to tickle their palates with this glorious fruit, what need of nightingales' tongues and other now impossible delicacies.

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It is known that apples had been introduced into Great Britain before the Roman conquest and spread over the entire island by the end of the third century. In 1629 apple seeds were brought over to New England
