### FINE NEW STATION OPENED TO PUBLIC

Hood River turned another lap in its history of improvement Sunday, when the handsome new depot erected by the O-W. R. & N. Co. was opened to the public. The order to occupy it was received by Agent J. H. Fredrick Saturday afternoon, and bright and early Sunday morning the office force moved into their new quarters and the doors were thrown open to the public.

The new station is a credit to the city, outside and in, and will accommodate many more people with greater convenience than the old structure. The finish of the interior is of Oregon fir, with benches to match. The sidewalk for four feet has a wainscoting in green fresco, with the rest of the wall and ceiling in yellow. The building is heated throughout with the latest hot water heating apparatus. The waiting room is lighted by large globes set in the ceiling, while other parts of the building have drop and side lights. There is a smoking room for men and a retiring room for ladies, with adequate and sanitary toilets. The floors through the entire building are laid in cement, with base boards in red marble. Three entrances lead into the waiting room, and it also has inside communication with the baggage room. The latter is substantially fitted up. Platform scales for weighing baggage, a private office for the baggage man, and commodious storage room are some of its features.

The ticket office corresponds to the other parts of the building in its handsome finish. Communication with it for passengers is through a large bronze grated window, while there is also an entrance for trainmen from the outside. A driveway on the south side of the building permits passengers to step direct from a vehicle into the station, while wide cement platforms give adequate accommodation for crowds at train time.

### REV. W. B. YOUNG OPENS PASTORATE

Rev. W. B. Young, the newly appointed pastor of Asbury Methodist church of Hood River, preached his introductory sermon Sunday to a large congregation and the members of the local church seemed well pleased with the new minister. Rev. Young comes to Hood River from Palouse, Idaho. His initial effort in the local pulpit was listened to closely by the large congregation, which expressed its approval at the conclusion of the service. Mr. Young also made a favorable impression with his congregation in a social way and commences his pastorate here under most favorable circumstances. He has a wife and two children and he and his family expect to shortly be settled in the parsonage.
