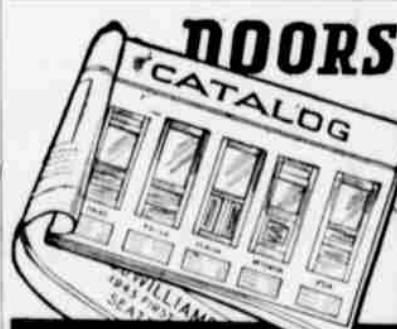
Joe Porter was noted in the Portland papers as a visitor at the apple show.
