**OREGON APPLE SHOW TO RIVAL SPOKANE**

Determination of the many important details incident to arranging for a "greater apple show" that will even surpass the annual exhibition now held at Spokane, says the Oregonian, was Thursday referred to a special subcommittee, the appointment of which was authorized by G. F. Johnson, president of a special committee appointed by the Portland Commercial Club to arrange for such a show. Mr. Johnson will announce the membership of the committee later.

The general committee held a meeting at the Commercial Club Thursday afternoon. First of the essential subjects discussed by the committee informally was the scope of the proposed exhibition. The question of finances also was considered briefly, but all of these details were left for the solution of the subcommittee and will not be acted upon finally until this committee submits its report to the full committee.

Among the other questions to be considered by the subcommittee is whether the exhibition that is planned shall be confined exclusively to apples or whether it shall embrace agricultural products generally.

The time of the year in which it is best to hold the show also remains to be determined. Some members of the committee would hold the exhibition in the fall. Others favor merging the show, if possible, with the Rose Festival, and thereby hold the display in June.

One thing is reasonably certain, and that is, that the show will be provided. Interest among the members of the committee having the subject in hand is intense, the importance of the horticultural industry to the state and an appreciation of the great value such a show would

be to the state contributing to that interest.

Present at the meeting of the committee were the following members: G. F. Johnson, chairman; H. L. Pit-Plecock, Robert Livingston, C. A. Malboeuf, A. P. Bateham, of Mosier, and F. W. Power, of Portland, president and secretary, respectively, of the Oregon State Horticultural Society; Carl R. Gray, president of the Hill roads in Oregon; Julius L. Meier, H. L. Corbett, A. C. Jackson, C. A. McCargar, M. A. Mayer and W. J. Hoffmann.

**WYOMING ELK IN OREGON PRESERVE**

Through the efforts of State Game Warden William L. Finley, on his recent visit at Washington, D. C., the government has been persuaded to donate fifteen elk to the state of Oregon. These animals will be taken from the forest reserves in Wyoming, crated and transported to Oregon as soon as the people of this state provide an adequate pasture for them. They will become the sole property of Oregon and serve to perpetuate a race of noble animals that is rapidly becoming extinct.

In the northwestern part of the state there is a 2500-acre pasture that has been set aside by the national government for testing the utility of a coyote-proof fence. It is said to have proven effective for that purpose, and the forestry service, according to Warden Finley, is willing to give this big park to the state as an elk reserve. The matter of location, however, has not been settled, as this is a question that will be left largely to the state at large, as it is distinctly a matter of public interest.
