## PROPER CARE WILL SAVE TREES INJURED BY STORM

(Continued From Page 1) produce heavy yields of healthy fruit true to type. To remove a strong growing root and replace it with a tree from the nursery is a mistake. The well established root system will in two or three years produce a top growth that will be nearly as large if not as large as one on an injured specimen of the same season's setting.

Generally the use of grafting wax has not given very satisfactory results. The following formula and method of mixing produces a wax that gives almost universal satisfaction and is the only one recommended for orchard work. To prepare the wax use: Rosin, five pounds; beeswax, one pound; charcoal (pulverized very finely) one-half pound; raw linseed oil, one gill.

Melt the rosin and beeswax together over a slow fire. Stir in the charcoal slowly in order to make a smooth mixture. Then stir in the raw linseed oil or grease of some form. This wax will become very hard. Before cooling pour it in greased pans or paper boxes which have been coated with oil. Large quantities may be made at one time and stored until needed, as this wax may be kept indefinitely. To apply this wax it must be melted and applied while warm. A small paint brush is the most desirable tool for making the applications. A special grafting pot is found most serviceable while using this wax. A plan of the pot may be had at the office of the plant pathologist.
