Generally the use of grafting waxes has not given very satisfactory re-J. C. Johnsen sults. The following formula and method of mixing produces a wax that gives almost universal satisfaction and is the only one recommend-

ed for orchard work. To prepare the wax use: Rosin, five pounds; beeswax, one pound; charcoal (pulverized very finely) one-half pound; raw linseed off, one gill. Melt the rosin and beeswax togeth-Home of er over a slow fire. Stir in the charcoal slowly in order to make a smooth mixture. Then stir in the raw linseed oil or grease of some

form. This wax will become very hard. Before cooling pour it in greased pans or paper boxes which have been coated with oll. Large quantities may be made at one time al SHOES and stored until needed, as this wax may be kept indefinitely. To apply

this wax it must be melted and ap-

plied while warm, A small paint


