

WILL TAX FRUIT TREES IN STATE OF WASHINGTON

Fruit trees in Washington are not to be exempt from assessment for taxation purposes. The state tax commission so ruled in a formal opinion to the assessor of Chelan county. It has been the custom in many sections of the state to exempt fruit trees, but there is no authority for this under the constitution and supreme court decisions, holds the state tax commission, although the legislature did pass a law exempting them.

The tax commission cites a decision of the supreme court to show that the legislature had no power to exempt any property from taxation. It is announced by the commission that some counties have exempted fruit trees, while in other countles the trees are taxed.






