Yuan Shih Kai was unanimously chosen president of the new Chinese republic to succeed Dr. Sun Yat Sen, who resigned. The one hundred and eightieth anniversary of the birth of George Washington was celebrated. Frank M. Ryan and Herbert S. Hoehn were among the forty men arrested simultaneously throughout the United States in connection with the government dynamite probe. As the result of the claim made by Folke E. Brandt, ex-valet of Millionaire M. L. Schiff of New York, that he had railroaded an investigation was begun into his thirty year sentence for theft. Abram Gonzales, governor of Chihuahua, in a public proclamation declared that the United States was planning to enslave Mexico. The looting of haciendas about Juarez continued.
