FIXED BY ROADS

Eastbound summer tourist and excursion rates from all points in the Northwest to all points in the East have been announced by the roads radiating out of Portland. The rates for the round trip, which are the same as they have been in the last few years, will be as follows:

URGES STANDARD
BOX BE ADOPTED

A dispatch from North Yakima says: J. L. Dumas, formerly owner of an orchard at Dayton known as the largest in the state and now on the faculty of the State College, gave notice to the fruitgrowers of this district, in a talk at a farmers institute, that they must bestir themselves to get a standard apple box adopted. The Lafean apple box bill is again before Congress, and the Northwest growers, he says, should lose no time in making known their opposition. But standardization is necessary, he declares, and the thing to do is to get the country to adopt the Northwest standard. Mr. Dumas also believes there are too many varieties of apples recognized. He would reduce the list to 50. He has reduced it to 40, with spaces for 10 to be filled by popular choice, and has submitted a report to this effect to the American Pomological Society.
