MAY VOTE BONDS AT GENERAL ELECTION

The county may be able to vote bonds for a good roads system at the general election in November in the hope of County Judge Culbertson, who directed a letter to Attorney General Crawford the last of the week asking whether this could not be done under an initiative petition. The letter follows:

"Referring to the recent decision of the state supreme court on the Jackson county road bonds case and the opinion of two or more members of that court in that decision to the effect that any county in the state under the operation of the Constitutional Amendment of Article IX at the election of 1910 was legally authorized to initiate laws at any general election held thereafter providing for bond issues for the permanent improvement of public roads, is it your opinion that the counties are so empowered by this amendment? If so authorized, would the general form of initiative petition prescribed for use in the enactment of state laws and the manner of circulation of the same be adequate in every way for such county purposes?"
