HOLDS HIS APPLES FOR HIGH PRICES

According to the White Salmon Enterprise, Eugene Kuhne has been packing and shipping apples the past few weeks, finding a good market in Portland. Last fall Mr. Kuhne erected an apple house with basement, through which he runs a small stream of water when the apples go into storage. The basement is the storage part of the building, the upper floor being used for grading and boxing, as well as temporary storing. Ventilator flues lead from each corner of the building. This is the largest private apple house in the district. Mr. Kuhne has a grader of his own invention, run-ways tapering from the sorting box, numbered every inch or two, and when the apple reaches the point where it sticks in the padded run-way it is taken out and put in a box. In this way the boxes are uniform to a neat and come put just right in the pack every time.

DAM SITE ON THE WHITE SALMON RIVER IS MOVED

Stone & Webster, the Seattle contractors who are building a dam on the White Salmon River five miles north of Underwood for the Northwestern Power Company, have been compelled to move half a mile north of the present site, being unable to find bedrock. They drove a tunnel 150 feet long back from the river, but were unable to find anything but gravel. They have been at work there for almost a month, and the search for bedrock is proving expensive.

"DRY WALL" TO BE BUILT AT THE SHELL ROCK CUT

When Governor West, President W. J. Clemens of the Portland Auto club, President C. T. Prall of the Oregon Association for Highway Improvement, Mr. Covert and railroad officials visited Shell Rock, Superintendent Bollons said the loose rock was but of the surface, and that when the railroad was being built at that point superficial excavation had resulted in the discovery of solid rock at a depth of a few feet.

It is proposed that in making the cut what is known as a "dry wall"—rock without cement—will be built above the road to prevent slides. This is work upon which the contract will be engaged first of all.

Mr. Clemens, upon his return to Portland, said: "I have received requests from California for 25 of our tour and road books. The Philadelphia Touring Club has sent for an equal number. I have received similar requests from New York, Washington and Chicago. The fact that in Portland this summer we are to have both the beautiful Rose Festival and the gorgeous Elks' reunion has intensified national interest in Oregon."

Resetting Trees
Uniformly poor results have followed the replacing of trees that died immediately by other trees of the same kind. But if the hole is opened up in the fall and allowed to lie until in the spring it is safe to then plant out a tree of the same kind as that which died. The hole should be opened out a good deal wider and deeper than necessary to receive the new tree. The purpose should be to get out a large part of the dirt around the root system of the first tree that occupied the land.

PUTNAM ENDORSED BY ODELL LEAGUE

John R. 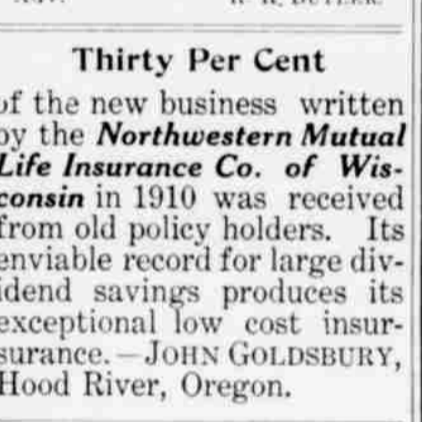
