If a cold, wet spell comes when apples are in bloom, spray with bordeaux mixture to prevent scab. This fungous is always most destructive in a cool, wet spring.

Do not expect satisfaction from bordeaux mixture that has stood for as much as 24 hours. It deteriorates quickly.

When done spraying each day, run some clean water through the pump to wash out the spray mixture and avoid corrosion of the working parts. Be sure that the engine and pump

are working perfectly. Valves may need repacking, and this takes time. hence the importance of giving the machine a thorough trial before time

A good agitator on the spray pump is as important as a good pump. It prevents settling of the polson and insures the first of the spraying to be as strong as the last. Strain all spray materials through
