## LIVE NEWS FROM AROUND THE STATE

Dallas Observer: In keeping with other progressive communities, McMinville has taken the preliminary steps toward paving a section of her business streets.

Sixteen counties have reported to the Woodrow Wilson committee, and all say Wilson is the favorite, with a long lead over the other Democratic candidates for the indorsement of the party in Oregon. Presidential preference primaries. In some of the counties the reports say that no other candidate is being seriously considered, and that Wilson will receive more votes than all other candidates combined.

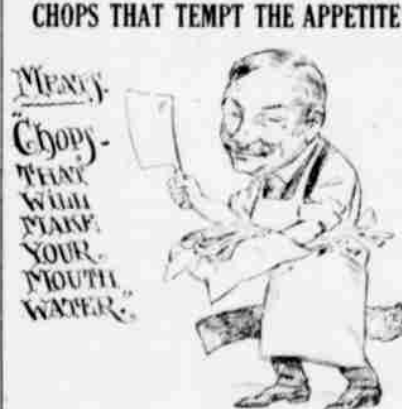

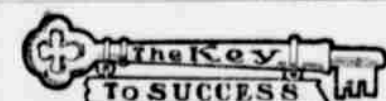
