APPLE SUPPLY IN EAST IS REDUCED

According to recent dispatches from the East, the arrival of this month sees the cold storage apple deal in good shape. Stocks have been reduced to a normal amount. In fact, in some centers there are fewer apples now than there were a year ago at this time. One dealer who is generally well posted said that according to reports he had received, there were fewer apples left for spring markets than was the case last year. His reports showed that a number of shipping stations were bare of cold storage apples.

The movement has been heavy. The consumption has simply been enormous. Most dealers had plenty of orders and in addition a number of cars went out on consignment. But the movement of apples on consignment is smaller than it was, orders being on the increase. Many cities have exhausted their stocks and are sending in orders for cold storage Baldwin. That variety has the call, as Kings and Greenings have practically cleaned up. There are some Greenings, but the bulk of them are not good enough for market. When holders have choice to fancy Greenings they are getting high prices for them.
