stacle has been the refusal of the bond companies to accept the bond issues for purchase of the water system and its reconstruction, a technical defect having been discovered. After much careful deliberation a proposition is now being considered by the council whereby the delay would be done away with.

It is proposed that the charter might be revised increasing the debt limit from \$5,000 to \$50,000. Warrants could then be issued to the amount of \$37,000 for purchase of the water plant and the work of laying the new mains and later the construction of pavement could be pushed to completion.

Although the proposition is as yet only under consideration it is no doubt one which will commend itself to all who desire to see the improvements, so long delayed, put through this season.

WORK STARTED ON WHITE SALMON ROAD

A gang of men has begun slashing the route of the proposed railway to be built from the North Bank road to White Salmon at the top of the bluff. Grading would have begun some time ago but for a hitch in financing the proposition. In the early winter the citizens of the town pledged about \$12,000 as encouragement for the road, but since then some of the principal property holders representing the Mount Adams Railway Company have taken over the matter and will back the loan necessary to build the road. These men are C. L. Colburn, R. Field, R. Lauterbach, T. Wyers Sr. and A. H. Jewett.

The cost of the road is estimated at about \$50,000, and not only will it be a great convenience to the town but will be assurance to residents of the back country of the ultimate coming of a road, for the Mount Adams Company already has a survey made to Camas valley and Trout lake.
