WORK ON THE NEW PLANT STARTS SOON

Work will be started without delay on the new cold storage plant which is to be built by former members of the Union who were superseded in control of that organization at the recent meeting. C. H. Sprout, who was manager of the Union, will act in a similar capacity for the new organization, which is to be incorporated as a close corporation. Its members will include several of the largest growers in the valley.

It is the intention of the new company to erect a plant which will have a capacity of 100,000 boxes of apples. A site 200x200 feet in size has been secured abutting on the eastern extension of State street and the Mt. Hood Railroad Company's right of way east of the city. As the site is outside the fire limits, it is planned to construct a frame building with concrete foundations. A representative of the firm of Bell & Wildman of Portland was here the last of the week going over the plans for the new building with those interested. This same company also installed the refrigerating plant for the Union. They will also act in consultation with those interested in the new building in preparing the plans.

Manager Sprout concluded his work with the Union on Saturday. He says that the new company has already secured trackage facilities at Van Horn and Odell, where sub-loading stations will be constructed. The new board of the Union met last week and elected the following officers: W. B. Dickerson, president; L. E. Clark, vice-president; Albert Sutton, secretary, and O. L. Walters, treasurer.

BIG COMPANY ORGANIZED

The permanent organization of the Oregon Home Builders was effected this week with a capital stock of \$100,000. The company consists of the most prominent men in the West. Thomas Prince is acting president. He is vice-president of the Reed-Prince Mfg. Co. of Worcester, Mass., and is also heavily interested in the Yamhill county walnut properties. Oliver K. Peterson, a well-known merchant of the Willamette Valley, formerly mayor of Forest Grove, and ex-vice-president of the First National Bank of that place.

WANT SEWER TAKEN UP FROM THE FLAT

The mayor and council have received a letter from Attorney H. H. Riddell of Portland, representing the Hood River Terminal Company, complaining that the city is trespassing on their property north of the O. R. & N. tracks by having placed the sewer too near the surface and directing the city to remove the sewer from its present location and to restore the land to its former status.

The terminal company alleges that it was ready to make some improvements on the land but that on arranging for leveling off part of the ridge caused by the sewer it was found that the pipe had been laid at the top of the ground instead of four feet under the surface.

The council at its meeting the last of the week took cognizance of the letter and instructed City Attorney Derby to take the proper steps for condemning the strip of land occupied by the sewer.

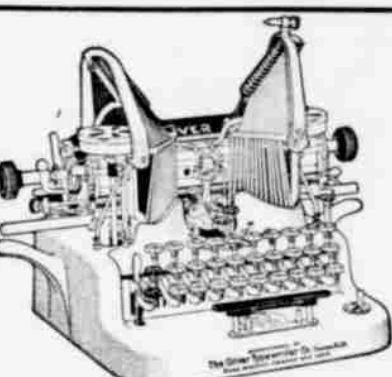
