WHITE SALMON

(From the Enterprise) E. Brayford of Hood River has purchased the C. Billington grocery store in the north end of town.

Emil Steger, German Consul at Seattle, has taken an interest in the White Salmon country and sends notice of intention to look the district over for not only the benefit of himself, but for friends.

Strawberries are blossoming, are heavy in foliage, healthy, and indicate a heavy crop of the kind that makes White Salmon famous. The acreage will be increased this year, and the prospect is that the Union will have the busiest season since the organization.

A bungling attempt was made to rob the Clark County bank at Washougal last Tuesday when robbers cut a hole through the roof of the vault and attempted to blow up the structure with dynamite. The attempt failed because of the heavy railroad iron with which the top of the vault was protected.

While helping build a bridge across the White Salmon river for the Northwestern Electric Co. at "The Jaws," Peter Druselet, a Greek laborer, slipped from a log, fell 40 feet into the river and was drowned Saturday morning. When Druselet fell he struck a jutting rock on his back, which turned him over and he struck another rock farther down on his head. When he came to the surface his face was downwards and he made no struggle, indicating that he was rendered unconscious or killed by striking the rocks. He quickly went out of sight in the swiftly flowing water through the canyons. Druselet was employed through a Portland agency and had no family.

Notice of Improvement of Street

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Ordinance No. 271, passed by the Common Council of the City of Hood River on the 8th day of April, 1912, and approved by the Mayor on the 9th day of April, 1912, providing for the improvement of Sherman Avenue from the West line of Sixth Street, west to the East line of Ninth Street, except in front of each property as herein provided for the improvement of which under this ordinance shall have been issued; that bids will be received by the undersigned City Recorder at his office, 211 Oak Street, in said city up to 12 o'clock noon on the 3rd day of May, 1912, for the improvement of said street by grading the same to the established grade, as established by this ordinance, from curb line to curb line, and the construction of cement walks and curbs along the South side of said street as provided for by the City Surveyor. The work of grading said streets and sidewalks shall be let in one contract and the construction of said cement sidewalks and curbs shall be let in a separate contract and each of said contracts shall be required to be completed within sixty days from the date of awarding the same.

Said bids shall be opened by the Street Committee as well as practicable after the time fixed for receiving the bids, and the several bids, together with the summary thereof, shall be reported to the Common Council at its next regular meeting thereafter, to-wit, on the 8th day of May, 1912, at the County Court House, in said city, at which time said bids will be considered.

Notice is further given that any interested party may file his objection to the letting of said contract within the time specified for receiving bids; and that the same will be transmitted to the City Council along with the bids, and their consideration at said meeting. The person, firm or corporation to whom the contract is let will be required to enter into an agreement to the effect that said contractor shall look alone for payment for material and work to such particular portion of the improvement to be assessed upon the property liable to pay for such improvement and paid into the City treasury for that purpose, as shall be assessed and collected and paid into the City treasury, and such contractor shall in no event require the City of Hood River or any of its officers or agents to pay the same, except out of such particular portion of said funds so assessed or collected into the City treasury, and for such portion of said improvement, nor seek to enforce payment of the same on any part thereof against the City of Hood River or any of its officers by any legal process or otherwise, except out of such particular fund.

All bids must state price for grading said streets to grade, and price for constructing said curbs and sidewalks, which work shall be done in the manner and form provided for in General Improvement Ordinance No. 194 of the City of Hood River. No bids will be received which specify more than one price on said work chargeable to one block in length. A bond for the faithful performance of the contract to an amount equal to 25 per cent of the estimated contract price will be required of the successful bidder, the Council reserving the right to reject any and all bids.
