OREGON'S BIRTHDAY COMES TOMORROW

Tomorrow will be the 60th anniversary of the birthday of American civil government on the Pacific coast. The act of the people that day—only 102 persons assembled—by the adoption of the report of a previously appointed committee, was the starting point of the provisional government of Oregon. The people living in Oregon at that time numbered less than 300 Americans. This organization performed every function of the National government of the United States until March 3, 1849, when the Oregon territorial government was set up by the proclamation of Governor Joseph Lane, an appointee of President Polk, by which act Oregon was formally admitted to the Union.

Mourning for the Titanic's dead and rendering thanks for those who were saved, members of all denominations united at the Christian church Sunday evening in a memorial service. Mayor E. O. Blanchard presided and made brief introductory remarks. "Nearer My God to Thee," the hymn which was played by the ship's orchestra as the craft went down, was sung by the audience. Rev. E. T. Simpson gave a Scripture reading and offered prayer. Mrs. C. H. Sletton rendered the offertory solo, "Come Unto Me." This was followed by an address "Thanksgiving for the Saved," Rev. J. H. Swift. Rev. W. B. Young spoke on "The Titanic's Dead," following which the M. E. church choir rendered the anthem "My Father Knows." "What God Did," was the subject of a discourse by Rev. E. A. Harris. Mrs. Charles Henney rendered the solo, "He Leadeth Me," after which the service closed with the singing of "Jesus Savior, Pilot Me," by the congregation and the benediction.

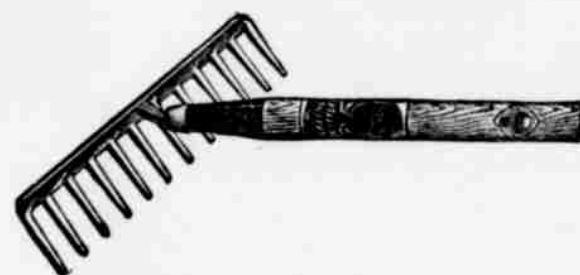

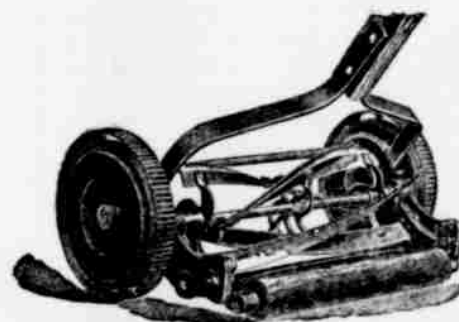

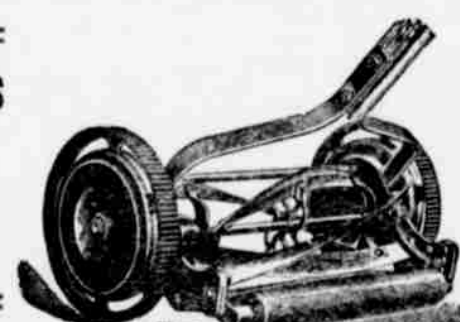
