EXPERTS REPORT ON WINTER INJURY

The subject of winter injury of fruit trees, which is being studied in the Hood River Valley, has also been under investigation by the horticulturists in Washington and the following report has been made:

"During the past winter reports have been received by the Washington State Horticultural Experiment Station of a great many young orchards that have been more or less injured by winter killing of the young trees. This has not been due in each case to excessive cold, but more frequently to the trees being permitted to grow rapidly and finally checked by frost.

"The winter killing of young trees is usually indicated by dark colored blotches on the bark and sap wood. It is most common near the tips of the young shoots, but in many cases it is found in irregular blotches over the entire tree top and trunk.

"Trees that have been severely winter killed should be severely pruned, cutting away as much as possible of the injured wood and leaving only fresh, clean wood. Improve the process of cultivation and tillage the following season and usually the plants will, to a large extent, overcome the injury within a year or so. If the trunk of the tree is severely injured it can be cut back and permitted to send up the sprout which can take the place of the original top.

RAILROAD GRANTS THE RIGHT OF WAY

The last obstacle in the building of the Portland-Hood River road around Shell Rock was removed this week when the O. R. & N. Company accepted the right-of-way surveyed by County Surveyor Murray Kay.

County Judge Culbertson, Mr. Kay and W. L. Clarke returned the last of the week from Portland, where they attended a conference with the railroad officials. The only point at which the route of the road must be changed is at the sliding rock just east of Shell Rock.

YAKIMA SETS HER GRADES FOR APPLES

The following grades will be used for Yakima Valley apples this year:

Extra Fancy—Each specimen must be a well formed, fully matured apple, free from all insect pests, worms, worm stings, scale, scab, sun scald, dry rot, water core or other defects. Limb rub, skin puncture or other evidence of rough handling will be considered defects.

Fancy—This grade shall consist of well formed, fully matured apples, free from all insect pests, worms, worm stings, scale, scab, sun scald, dry rot, water core or other defects. Limb rub, skin puncture or other evidence of rough handling will be considered defects.

C Grade—All merchantable apples not included in the Extra Fancy and Fancy grades will be accepted in this grade. Each apple to be free from worms, scale or other infectious diseases. Apples to be wrapped unless otherwise specified.

Notice for the Improvement of Street

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Ordinance No. 275, passed by the Common Council of the City of Hood River, on the 15th day of April, 1912, approved by the Mayor on the 16th day of April, 1912, providing for the improvement of State Street from the West line of Front Street west to the West line of Ninth Street; Oak Street from the West line of First Street west to the West line of Fifth Street and Cascade Avenue from the West line of First Street to the West line of Fifth Street and Second Street, Third Street and Fourth Street from the North line of State Street to the South line of Cascade Avenue by treating the surface for a width of 24 feet with crushed oil at the rate of one-half a gallon to the square yard of surface of roadway.

Said bids will be opened by the Street Committee as soon as practicable after the time fixed for receiving bids, and the several bids, together with the summary thereof, will be reported to the Common Council at its next regular meeting thereafter, to-wit, on the 7th day of May, 1912, at the County Court House in said city, at which time said bids will be considered.

Notice is further given that any interested party to his objection to any proposed bid, and that the same will be transmitted to the City Council along with said bids for their consideration at said meeting. The person, firm or corporation to whom the contract is let will be required to enter into an agreement to the effect that said contractor shall look alone for payment for material and work to such particular portion of the improvement as he may be awarded, and to the charge of which a particular part of the improvement to be done by the successful bidder is to be made and collected and paid into the city treasury, and such contractor shall in no event require the City of Hood River or any of its officers or agents to pay the same, except out of such particular fund.

A bond for the faithful performance of the contract to be amount equal to 25 per cent of the estimated contract price will be required of the successful bidder, the Council reserving the right to reject any and all bids.
