Evidence was introduced by the electric company tending to show that they have been making preparations to rebuild their entire system in the city at a cost of from \$17,000 to \$18,000 and that they have already made surveys with this in view. They also stated that the material is all at hand except the poles and that the construction foreman is here ready to start work.

They contended that this was proof that a reconstruction of the lines in the near future was not intended.
