SLIDING DOWN A ROPE.

It Is Both Easy and Safe When Done

Sliding down a rope is not so simple as it seems. Few know how to do it properly. If you try to descend by letting the rope slide through your hands the friction will burn the palms so that you will have to let go after a few feet. If you try to lower your weight from one hand hold to another you are sure to become tired and will be forced to drop. You cannot slide with the rope between your knees, for the swaying of your body will jerk the rope out of the clutch of your knees, and then you are likely to fall.

The easiest and safest method you can employ is that used by firemen and sallors. Standing upright, throw out your right leg and give it a turn around the rope. Next put the rope in the crook of your right elbow and clasp it tightly, not in your hand, but in your arm.

In that way you can slide to safety without the slightest trouble. The rope does not touch any part of the body that is not protected by clothing, and your speed can be regulated by either straightening or cramping your eg. Once learned this method of sliding down a rope may prove in an emergency the means of saving your life or the lives of other persons .-Youth's Companion.


