### HOOD RIVER SPORTSMEN, ATTENTION!

The State Board of Fish and Game Commissioners have undertaken a thorough revision of the present system of the game laws. The idea is to present a code for adoption at the next Legislature, which will give more complete protection to fish and game, and correct numerous errors in the present system of laws.

The Commission desires in making up this new game code to get a thorough expression of public opinion before the code is presented to the Legislature. For this reason the members of the Commission ask that residents in different parts of the state, especially farmers, fruit growers, as well as sportsmen, send in any suggestions so that the Commission may act upon them. Suggestions are also sought from the grange, commercial bodies, rod and gun clubs and other organizations, in order to get a game code suitable for different parts of the state.

All communications and suggestions should be sent to Mr. J. F. Hughes, secretary of the Game and Fish Commission, Salem, Oregon.

At present there are a number of questions under discussion, that will be of interest to sportsmen in different parts of the state, such as the questions of bounties on predatory animals. The Commission is in favor of a more rigid effort to exterminate cougar and wolves. The question that has been agitated in certain parts of the state to reduce the non-resident hunting and fishing license to the same price as the resident license. Many sportsmen are also in favor of reducing the limits on deer and other game.

### SOUTHERN PACIFIC DOUBLE TRACKS

The contract for the construction of fifteen miles of second track on the Southern Pacific, which will connect the towns of Truckee, California, and Reno, Nevada, has just been awarded. This is the latest part of the construction of a second track on the Harriman lines between Omaha and San Francisco.

A large part of the proposed double tracking of the Southern Pacific has already been completed. Between Sacramento and Colfax the second track is already in operation. The laying of the second track from Benicia to Sacramento, a distance of 58 miles, is completed with the exception of 8 miles between Webster and Washington.

Between the Oakland Pier and Port Costa the second track has been in operation for some months. From the Pier to Richmond the company is operating four tracks continuously. A little more than 25 miles of second track has been laid and is being operated on the Salt Lake division of the road approximately to the Lucin cut-off. The laying of the second track over Nevada will not be such a problem, as has been the same kind of work in the mountain districts. By the first of October there will be about 142 miles of double track line in operation.

### ELKS VISIT HOOD RIVER VALLEY

While no formal effort was made by Hood River to entertain the visiting Elks at Portland, a large number of the B. P. O. E. availed themselves of the opportunity of seeing the Hood River valley by making the trip to Hood River on the steamer Gatzert and returning on the late evening train. A large crowd of San Francisco boosters were in the city Friday and did the town in an innocent way. When ready to take the train they started up the song, "How Dry I Am, How Dry I Am," to the tune of "O, Happy Day," and they sure did some singing that caused the old timers around the depot to stand on their tip toes and prick up their ears. It may be that some of the old residents were expecting to get a glimpse of some one pulling a cork, but there was nothing doing.

**Local Nimrods Whip West Fork**  
L. W. Clark and Judge A. J. Derby left Sunday for a ten days' stay on the headwaters of Hood River to try their luck angling the speckled beauties of the clear water fork of Hood River. It is stated by parties who have been fishing on the west fork that it is exceptionally fine this season. The stream from the slide up the river is one of the finest fishing grounds in the valley.

**Circus Day Draws Crowd**  
Notwithstanding the fact that the Kit Carson Circus struck the city on a legal holiday appointed by Governor West, and when over one half of the citizens had gone to Portland to witness the Elks' parade, a large number of the farmers were in the city and attended the wild animal show. The company carries three brass bands. Music, pennants, popcorn and red lemonade were the order of the day.

**Teal Continues High Water Landing**  
The steamer J. N. Teal of the Open River Transportation company is still landing near Hood River. Their dock has been moved down the Hood river channel to a position of easy access for the transfer companies of the city. The dock of the Regulator line of steamers was moved to the low water landing east of the city last week. Both boat companies have done a heavy freight and passenger business during the period that the steamers could make the landings near the city.

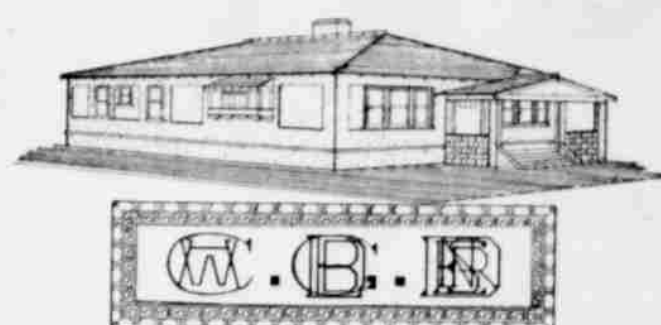
