FAST TRAINS PROVIDED BY RAILROADS
Anticipating heavy movements of fresh fruits and vegetables during the present season the North Bank road and the Oregon Electric railway have arranged to handle east-bound shipments in the quickest time possible.

As an illustration of what this service means to the shippers of the Willamette valley, Salem, Woodburn and Albany fruits and vegetables in carload lots may leave these points on the evening local of a Monday, for instance, and reach Vancouver the next evening to directly connect with the fast freight over the North Bank at 10:30 p. m. This puts the freight leaving the Willamette valley points Monday evening into Spokane Thursday where connections are made immediately with the G. N. and N. P. fast freights. Handled with the fast joint freight service of the Oregon Electric, North Bank, G. N. and N. P. the cars of fruits and produce reach St. Paul in four to five days after leaving Spokane, or the following Tuesday in the example given above in connection with the Willamette valley shipments leaving on a Monday night.

From White Salmon, Granddallas and other shipping points on the North bank line along the Columbia river, carload shipments will be picked up by the fast freight leaving Vancouver daily at 10:30 p. m. and hauled to Spokane for connection with the special service of the G. N. and N. P. railways arriving at St. Paul from six to seven days after shipment. From St. Paul to Chicago the time consumed is about thirty-six hours.

FRUIT DOGS WENATCHEE
Seven cars of fruit were shipped east last night and one went west this morning, says the Republican. These were all mixed cars. Very few apricots are coming in now and this week will see the last of them for this season.

Pears are reaching market in small quantities. Bartlett pears will start to move heavily the middle of next week.

The condition of fruit received in the local warehouses is very good up to the present time. Packing this year is on a higher standard than in previous years. The fruit is more uniform in size and presents a better appearance.

SIX COUNTIES FORGET ROOSEVELT'S POLICIES
The state treasurer today distributed \$352,481.16, which represents the interest from the irriduable common school fund for the past year, to various counties according to school population. Each county in the state except six shows a substantial increase in school population. The six which show a slight decrease are Gilliam, Josephine, Lake, Morrow, Sherman and Union. Curry county shows the same population as last year.

Other counties show the following increase in school population: Baker 109, Benton 314, Clackamas 816, Clatsop 44, Columbia 137, Coos 201, Crook 594, Douglas 342, Grant 97, Harney 1, Hood River 64, Jackson 462, Klamath 214, Lane 431, Lane 431, Lincoln 209, Linn 390, Malheur 135, Marion 925, Multnomah 1147, Polk 432, Tillamook 180, Umatilla 439, Walla Walla 165, Wasco 154, Washington 532, Wheeler 33, Yamhill 408.

ATLANTIC FRUIT COMPANY GAINS DECISION
The Atlantic Fruit Company of New York gained a point in its war with the United Fruit Company, the headquarters of which are in Boston, when Judge Lacombe, in the Federal District Court, denied an injunction sought by the United to prevent the Atlantic from handling fruit which the United contends is under contract to it.

The fight started about fourteen months ago, when Joseph di Giorgio organized the Atlantic Fruit Company and greatly enlarged his former operations. The company has obtained large shipments from Jamaica and Mexico, but until recently the United has maintained a practical monopoly in Columbia and Costa Rica.
