FRUIT QUARANTINE MEASURE IS PASSED

The Simmons fruit quarantine bill, of great value to every fruitgrower and horticulturist on the Pacific Coast, passed the House Saturday. The bill has been demanded by Coast fruitgrowers for a long time. It provides a rigid Federal quarantine in the United States against fruit, seeds, bulbs and nursery stock from other countries which may be infected with insect pests of any kind. The bill primarily was drawn to protect fruitgrowers against the Mediterranean fly and the Malolos orange worm, the latter coming across the Mexican border and having created havoc in Southern California. Heretofore the California state horticulturists had to fight these pests unassisted. The bill appropriates \$25,000 for the first year, and becomes effective October 1. After the first year the agricultural appropriation bill will carry an annual appropriation to enforce the quarantine. Representatives from the Coast have urged this bill before the agricultural committee several times, and it is due to their efforts that the measure was favorably reported and has passed the House. This bill will soon pass the Senate where it is unopposed.
