NORTHWEST'S APPLE CROP IS THE BEST

According to the report made by the International Apple Shippers' Association in session at Chicago last week, the quality of the apple crop throughout the United States is generally fair, with the exception of the Pacific coast states, where it is

The association secured at this meeting definite information and made a report on the apple crop of the United States, which indicates a probable crop of 40,000,000 barrels, compared with 30,000,000 barrels a year ago. The quality of the fruit in the Pacific coast group is given as good. In the middle west group it is poor to good in Indiana, Illinois and Missouri, while in Arkapsas it is poor, in Iowa and Nebraska fair to good, and in Kansas fair. In Oklahoma the trees were killed.

In the central group the quality is fair to good, with the exception of New Jersey and Wisconsin, where it is fair. In the New England group it is fair to good, and in the southern group it is fair in Maryland and Tennessee, poor to excellent in Virginia and West Virginia, fair to good in Kentucky and Delaware. In the Canadian group the quality is good in British Columbia and fair to good in Ontario and Nova Scotia

New York state report shows west rn section of the state has the best erop of Baldwins in its history. Greenings are fair, with the crop a fallure in sections. Kings are a good erop-20 ounce light. Quality finecrop two weeks late.


