### \$175,000 WORTH OF APPLES DESTROYED

The big plant of the Wenatchee Ice, Cold Storage & Canning Company was destroyed by fire the last of the week with a loss of \$350,000. A half dozen workmen were slightly injured and 50 were compelled to jump from the second-story windows. The plant was valued at \$75,000 and was partially covered by insurance, but the heaviest losers are fruit growers who had apples stored in the plant and whose losses are un-

protected. The fruit destroyed was valued at \$175,000. More than 100 growers lost from \$1000 to \$5000 each.

### HARD TO TELL HOW COUNTY WILL VOTE

Much speculation is heard as to how Hood River will go for President, but nobody is attempting to make any very definite predictions. The general feeling is, however, that the vote will be divided pretty evenly between the three candidates.  
In the primary election Taft and Roosevelt ran a close race in this county. Taft was in the lead when the ballots of the city and lower valley were counted, but the Upper Valley vote for Roosevelt was strong enough to swing the county into the Roosevelt column.  
It is conceded that Wilson will poll a much heavier vote than in the primaries, when only the Democrats voted for him. Indeed, it is predicted by some that independent voters who will support Wilson may bring him abreast of his two opponents.  
Not a few Republicans who supported LaFollette in the primaries declare their intention of voting for Taft next week, on the ground that in condemning McCusker Roosevelt sacrificed the LaFollette votes. They predict that enough Roosevelt votes will go to Taft to make him the victor in this county.  
Bull Moosers, who have an active organization in the county, are confident that Teddy will get a substantial majority, basing their hopes on the large vote given him in the primaries.  
The conclusion is that Taft, Wilson and Roosevelt are likely to run a close race in the county.
