Self-boiled lime-sulphur is a special spray originated for use on the peach for the control of brown rot and peach scab in the East. It is not as good a fungicide as the commercial lime-sulphur or Bordeaux mixture, but it has the advantage of not causing injury There is every reason to believe that it would not cause injury in the apple in Hood River and growers in that section are urged to give it a thorough trial. This spray mixture must not be confused with the old home boiled lime-sulphur. Dire tions for the preparation will be found in Circular Bulletin 13 of the Oregon Experiment Station, copies of which will be mailed on application to the Secretary. The arsenate of lead used for the control of the codling moth may be used in combination with this spray. If grow-
