HOOD RIVER WATER PERMITS GRANTED

During the quarter ending March 31, 1913, three permits to appropriate \$25,40. the waters of Hood River were issued by the state engineer. J. O. Hannum of Parkdale secured a permit to appropriate 50 second feet of plies, \$23,60. the waters of Fall Creek or Cold Spring Creek to complete the reclamation of 4000 acres of land under the Glacier Tritch. The water is to be diverted in Sec. 7, Twp. 2 South, Rg. 10 east and carried thence five miles by canal or flume to the head of the Glacier Ditch, through which it will be delivered to the land.

E. E. Cays of Hood River secured a permit to appropriate the waters of an unnamed spring for domestic use and the irrigation of 3 acres in Sec. 10, Twp. 2 North, Rg. 10 East,

During the quarter 114 permits have been issued throughout the state, un plies, \$3.76. der which it is proposed to irrigate 40,071 acres, develop 1,551 horsepower and supply water for domestic and municipal use. These permits also include 11 for the construction of reservoirs for the storage of 3,029 acre
