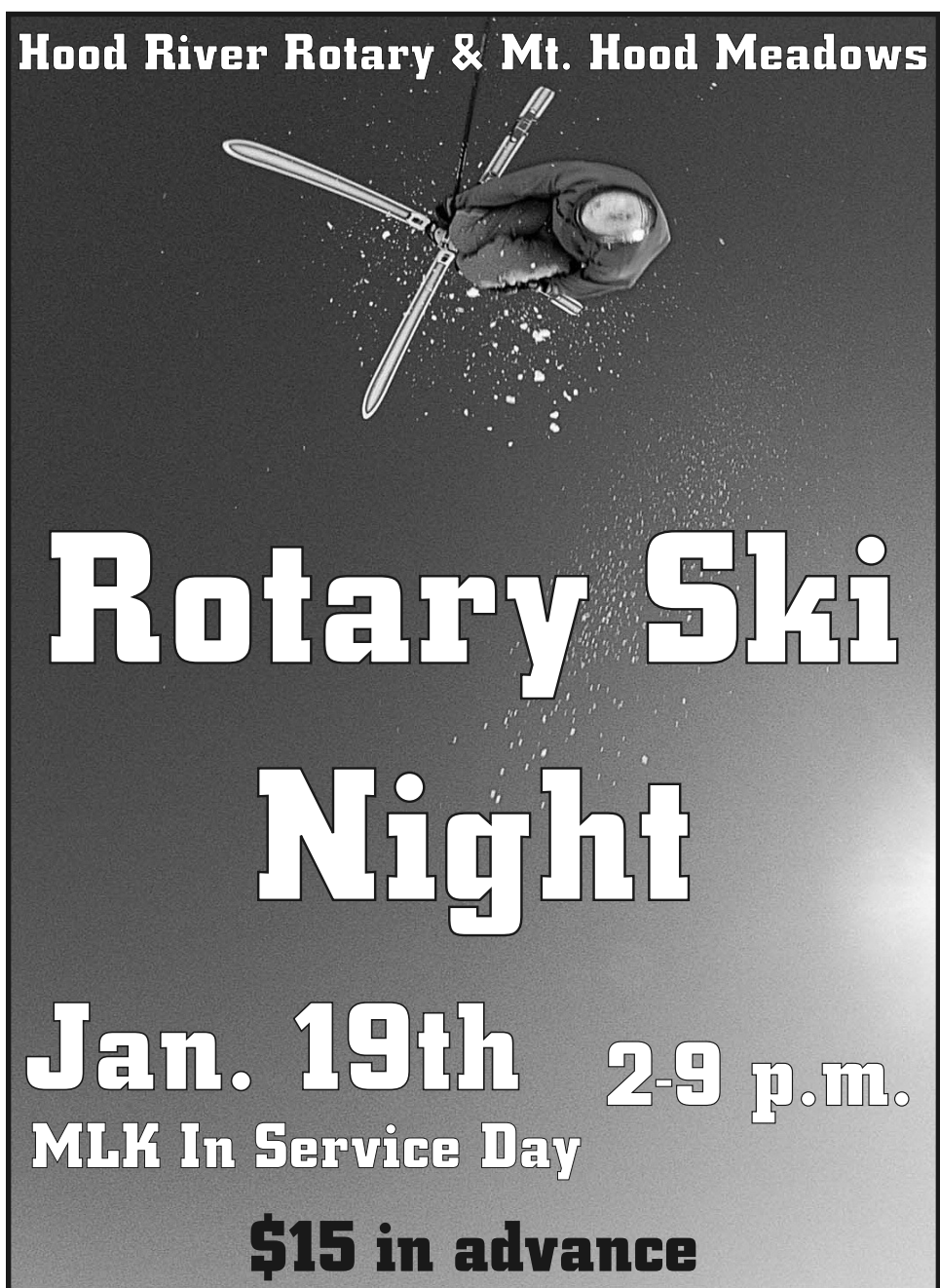

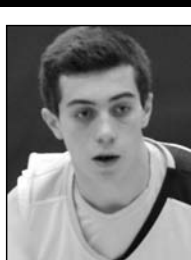

Pursuant to the Hood River County Zoning Ordinance, the Planning Director will make a decision regarding the following application on or around Fri, Feb 27, 2015:
Hood River Saddle Club (P-14-0268) is requesting a National Scenic Area Land Use Permit for the following improvements: Replace an existing sign with a new, slightly larger sign.

The proposed wood sign is 25 sq ft in size and two sided. The sign will be mounted on two 6-inch by 6-inch wooden posts. The applicant is also proposing to replace approx. 1,800 ft of an existing barbed wire fence with a new 5-foot high wire woven fence with wooden posts and rails.

The subject parcel is located on the NE corner of Belmont Dr. and Country Club Rd.; 3N 10E 33D, Tax Lot 4500. The parcel is zoned Rural Residential (G-RR-2) within the

General Management Area (GMA) of the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area. If you have comments on this application, please respond by 5:00 p.m., Fri, Jan 30, 2015.
