The AARP Tax Aide program will be offering free preparation and e-filing of income taxes for seniors and low- to moderate-income taxpayers through April 15.

Taxpayers must bring photo ID and social security cards/ITIN papers for all persons on the return in addition to all pertinent 2014 tax papers for income and deductions, and health in-

surance information for 2014 for all persons on the return. Also bring the 2013 tax return copy. The program does not allow preparation of returns which include rentals and complicated small businesses. Help is available Mondays, 2-7 p.m., downstairs at the Hood River Library, and Thursdays, 2-7 p.m., at the Hood River Valley Adult Center; use north door.

Rhoades presents in White Salmon

Last in library KOOBDOOGA program series

The Friends of the White Salmon Valley Community Library invite the public to attend a presentation by Seattle cinema scholar Lance Rhoades, titled "American Indians in Cinema: Participation Onscreen and Behind the Scene" on Saturday, Feb. 28 at 2 p.m. in the library's Sprint/Baker Gallery. This is the fifth and final event in a successful month-long series of Saturday afternoon programs held in connection with KOOBDOOGA: Community Reads 2015, inspired by the book "Short Nights of the Shadow Catcher: The Epic Life and Immortal Photographs of Edward Curtis" by Seattle author Timothy Egan.

The public image of American Indians has been more defined by cinema than that of any other people in history. When one considers that nearly 25 percent of all films made from 1900 to 1950 were Westerns (frequently represent-

ing American Indians as violent obstacles to progress), the lingering implications are staggering. In his presentation, Rhoades will prompt us to consider the formidable role cinema has played in producing, perpetuating and challenging perceptions of American Indians, past and present.

Rhoades completed his graduate studies in Comparative Literature and Cinema Studies at the University of Washington, where he taught several courses on American Indians in Cinema. He has also been a researcher and instructor in the University of Washington American Indian Studies, Comparative Literature, Cinema Studies, and Comparative History of Ideas programs. He was a recipient of the UW's 'Excellence in Teaching' award. Rhoades has presented talks in the Middle East, Asia and Europe on cultural history in film. Each year he teaches a course in the humanities at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Rhoades lectures on the history of literature and film in conjunction with the Speakers Bureau of Humanities Washington and he serves as a Program Director for the Mercer Island Library and Arts Council.
