Public Notice of Road Closures

On Saturday and Sunday, April 25th and 26th, some roads in northern Wasco and Hood River County's will be closed for the running of a motorsports event.

Closure notices, barricades and marshalling will be present to prevent unauthorized entry to the road course.

On Saturday, April 25th through access to Mason Cutoff, Fax, Adkisson, Hastings Ridge, Steuber, Center Ridge, and Easton Canyon roads will be closed. The event concludes on Saturday evening and all roads will be reopened by 7:30pm. Wrentham, Emerson, Ward, Boyd Loop, and Long Hollow roads will remain unaffected.

Written, sealed bids from qualified contractors will be received by the City of Hood River at the Hood River Public Works, 1200 18th Street, Hood River, Oregon 97031, until 2:00 p.m. on April 21, 2015, at which time they will be publicly opened and read. Bids shall be clearly marked BID for "22nd Street Sanitary Sewer Project 630" and shall show the date and time of bid opening. A mandatory pre-bid conference will be held on Tuesday April 14, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. at the City of Hood River's Public Works Building, 1200 18th Street, in Hood River. Statements made by Owner or Owner's representatives at the conference will not be binding upon the Owner unless confirmed by written Addendum. The meeting will conclude with a site visit.

Bidders must comply with ORS 279.027 regarding submission of First-Tier Subcontractor Disclosure Form by the deadline indicated on the form. Disclosure forms are provided in the Bid Documents.

The project area of work defined by this Contract is in Hood River, Oregon, from the existing sanitary manhole 35BD07 at the intersection of June St. and 22nd St. extending north along 22nd St. approximately 640' to an existing 8" concrete sanitary sewer line at the intersection of Prospect Ave. and 22nd St. The project will also continue west along May St.

from the new sanitary sewer line at 22nd St. and May St. approximately 135' to an existing 8" concrete sanitary sewer line extending north. The work to be done under this contract consists of installing approximately 775' of 8" PVC sanitary sewer line. The work will also include the installation of 5 new sanitary sewer manholes along 22nd St. and 1 new sanitary sewer manhole west of 22nd St. along May St.

Prequalification is not required; however, if not currently pre-qualified to work in the City of Hood River, the applicant must submit with its Bid, a completed City of Hood River Prequalification form.
